This drill weekend is here again already! It's packed with events and promises to be a fantastic time! Family day is Saturday, May 5 and there are a lot of things going on, so don't miss out.



There's an educational event for spouses in the morning, a "Passport to Adventure" program for kids that includes a sneak peek at an actual C-130

and a cookout/picnic for everyone from noon to 6 p.m. Saturday, May 5! Although this weekend adventure is our annual 440 AW Picnic and includes 2 AS members and their families, we are planning a Pope Field Octoberfest for the fall which all include all the Pope Field partners.

April has been another banner month for the 440 AW as we made great progress when it comes to flying hours and aircraft availability rates. Your hard work has really paid off and we have quickly moved up the rankings within 22AF where we are now the number 2 Wing for maintenance reliability! This is all due to the continuous hard work and dedication of our Pope Field Airmen. The wing went from 63.33% mission capable rate just 7 months to 71.33% in April. In addition, the 28 days ISO was reduced to 27 days. The 440 AW is now #1 in flying hours amongst all Air Reserve Component TFI units. Great news!

Another indicator of the tremendous accomplishments here at Pope are the numerous AFRC level awards many of our units and individuals have received. A huge tribute to the men and women of the 440th.

I attended the Air Mobility Command Spring Rally at MacDill and has the opportunity to spend time with Maj. Gen. Farris, Lt. Gen. Stenner and Gen Johns. Each had very complimentary remarks about what we are accomplishing here at Pope. We truly are the model TFI unit for the Air Reserve Component, and it's due to the dedication and hard work of every member of the 440th! Another big take-away for you from that conference is that although C-130s will fly less strategic airlift in the future, tactically, C-130s are still the airlift of choice in the theater of operation and the demand for Guard and Reserve assets remains steady.

Over the next couple of years there will be a number of base closures across the country. Fortunately Pope was not impacted by these actions. We will however have the opportunity to bring on some of our talented Reserve brothers and sisters from these installations as they draw down. During the Total Force Integration conference this month, it was confirmed that TFI is the way of the future. It was even announced that all new flying programs like the F-35 and KC-46 will be TFI units. In fact, senior leaders from the General Officer steering group at the same conference recognized Pope Field as the TFI model to emulate. Keep up the great work!

Deployments and returns continue to happen and while I said goodbye to some Security Forces folks, I am also looking forward to attending a Yellow Ribbon event with our 36 AES Airmen that have recently returned from deployment. Lt Col Trezza talked to the Chamber of Commerce in Fayetteville and got to brag on the returnees because while they were deployed, the 36 AES Airmen airlifted and cared for more than 3,500 patients! At least one patient was in such a critical state that they airlifted him all the way back to the United States.

The Compliance Inspection is still coming down the track. You have done a lot of hard work on MICT, appointment letters and all the requirements to be in compliance, but there is still a lot of work to do. Get as much work accomplished as you can toward the CI because during the June UTA we will take a snapshot of the Wing as a report card to see how far we've come...and how much we still have left to do. So, keep plugging away at the requirements and keep up the great work!

It's an honor to serve with you. We are Pope!

OPERATION FIT:

OP FIT will again be held during the May UTA, Pope Track, at the following times: Saturday, May 5 from 3:45 p.m.- 5:00 p.m. & Sunday, May 6 from 5:45 a.m.-7:00 a.m.

If you have an Unsatisfactory Score, are on a waiver, or are not current for fight to fight and are not scheduled to test during May's UTA, you are required to attend one session, along with your supervisor. Please wear your physical training uniform, bring your military ID and a water bottle. See you there!

PRIVILEGES, NOT REQUIREMENTS...

The 440 AW provides many services to its members which are privileges, not requirements. An example of a couple of these services is the Patriot Pope Airlift, and the Logistics Readiness Squadron-run base shuttle bus. Neither one of these services is required to be provided by the Wing; however at this time we feel it is in the best interest of the Wing to provide these items. With these services come some basic requirements such as signing up for the airlift on the Patriot Pope Website, or ensuring you're at a designated location for base shuttle pick-up, at the required time.

Other services, such as billeting, although required to be provided for folks designated as outside of the commute area, has some basic caveats which must be met. The number one item with billeting is each member has the responsibility to sign-up in a timely manner, using the Automated Lodging Request System. This enables the 440 AW to request the proper number of rooms to be set aside and paid for, ensuring our folks have billeting. It is the responsibility of the member to sign up using ALRS, and to cancel their reservation if the room will not be used for all or part of the reserved time. Please take these personal responsibilities seriously.

Force Development

What is the CCAF? The Community College of the Air Force is the only 2-year institution exclusively serving enlisted personnel. The accredited college awards the associate in applied science degree after a student successfully completes a degree program designed for an Air Force specialty.



The degree is obtained by combining your civilian college courses, your military formal schooling, and your military experience (5-Level in your AFSC).

Who is eligible? All enlisted personnel!

Why should you get yours? It looks great on your resume and it is vital for promotion and awards. To check your progress, simply go to the Air Force Portal Home Page, click on AFVEC-AF under the Education/Training/Force Development heading. Then, click on CCAF View Progress Report under the Self Service Heading.

Finance Tips

Keeping pay and allowances straight is a team effort between you, your finance office, and our military pay experts.

AskDFAS gets answers quick. Every individual is unique, but often face similar issues. For best results, browse the frequently asked questions database before submitting a question.

While these sites provide the descriptions of pay types and general eligibility requirements, your Reserve Military Pay Office in Finance can provide more detail as well as current rates. They can also help with entitlements based on your own individual circumstances.

More Finance!

Government Travel Card - Please remember that this card is to be used only for official travel expenses. If used properly, the card can make official travel much more convenient because the card may be used for essentially all reimbursable expenses rather than cash. In general, an item should not be purchased using a GTC if it may not be claimed on a travel voucher.

Members need to complete initial and refresher training on the use of the card once every three years. If you have not completed a statement of understanding or provided a training certificate to your Agency Program Coordinator (APC) since arriving to Pope, please do so at your earliest convenience. Your APC has training info and has additional reference material available to assist with managing delinquent accounts.

Defense Travel System – If you have not already registered, now is the time to do so. Members should register before they receive their first DTS Order. ARTs have two profiles, one for travel performed in civilian status and one for military status. Please see your unit Organizational Defense Travel Administrator for questions about registration. Profile information must be properly loaded for orders information to flow from AROWS into DTS.

Some things to look for include, naming convention (SSN+“R” for reserve profile), correct military status (Reserve instead of Active duty, or Civilian), service, and unit of assignment. In addition, please ensure GTC and bank account info are loaded before any orders are performed.

All orders state which system to file the voucher in. Please read the additional instructions on page 2 of the 938 or on the face of 1610 (civilian status orders) to determine whether file in DTS or in e-finance (“RTS”). Your ODTA may assist by showing how to sign imported AROWS authorizations, and how to create vouchers once DTS authorizations are approved. Once all info is loaded, and finance has completed its review, your DTS voucher will be paid within 4 days of approval by your squadron or group approving official.

Currently, most vouchers continue to be filed through E-finance, however, AFRC has indicated that the program will expand in the near future, as the remainder of AFRC units come on line. Once fully implemented, the vast majority of voucher issues will be handled locally, giving our members greater responsiveness and units more control over the travel reimbursement process.

Medical

Pregnant? CONGRATULATIONS!!!!

What's your next step? Report to your supervisor!



Reporting your pregnancy to your supervisor is required for all service members. Precautions need to be taken to minimize risk factors that might adversely affect your pregnancy.

DID YOU KNOW: Potential exposure to toxic chemicals, gases, ionizing radiation, hypoxia, etc. are all areas of concern and will need to be closely monitored!

Once your pregnancy is confirmed, please see Staff Sgt. Wendy Brown at 440 MDS, room 109. She will get you into the system and get your profile started.

Next, you will need to visit Public Health, Senior Airman Nekeshia Simmons, at 440 MDS in room 302. SrA Simmons will go out to your workplace and perform a workplace summary to identify hazards. Once this is determined, recommendations will be submitted to ensure your position in the workplace is safe from hazards.




OSS Spotlight
